Keep an open mind

Move past small talk

Going beyond surfacelevel interactions and engaging in deeper conversations facilitates genuine connections with BIPOC individuals.

Practice active listening

Showing empathy, asking follow-up questions and demonstrating understanding shows you value BIPOC individuals' thoughts and feelings and builds deeper connections.
