

2023 September Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

Suicide claimed the lives of more than 48,000 people in the U.S. in 2021. It is the second leading cause of death for children aged 10–14 and adults aged 35–44, and the third leading cause of death for young people aged 15–24. From 2004 to 2020, the prevalence of depression among children has increased 89%. The prevalence of mental health conditions among adults has increased 19% from 2008 to 2020. Of individuals aged 12 or older in 2021, 16.5% had a substance use condition. Of those who have a substance use condition, 25% died by suicide. Over 50% of deaths by suicide are associated with dependence on drugs and alcohol.

During September and throughout the year, Magellan Healthcare is committed to increasing awareness about the signs of suicide in yourself and others and the importance of speaking up when help is needed. People can and do recover from mental health and substance use conditions and anything that may be contributing to suicidal thoughts, going on to live happy, vibrant lives.
